Maintaining social distance at drop off and pick up: higher risk of infection spread if social distancing not maintained	Young people, Leaders, Parents/ Guardians	Activity Leads are to stagger arrival and departure times	Activity Leader	
Hygiene of people: higher risk of infection spread if proper hand washing not carried out	Young people, Leaders,	Activity Leads are to provide alcohol base hand sanitizer sufficient for the activity they are running	Activity Leader to provide and maintain sanitizer point(s)	
Hygiene of toilets: higher risk infection spread if hygiene not carried out	Young people, Leaders,	The two toilet cubicles MUST be sanitised by the Activity Lead on arrival and before finally departing the site	Activity Leader	
Hygiene of Water Tap	Young people, Leaders,	The water tap MUST be sanitised by the Activity Lead on arrival and before finally departing the site

Use of outdoor space	Young people, Leaders, Parents/ Guardians	The Activity Lead must comply fully with the current Scout Association Guidance for the undertaking of the activity whilst onsite, arriving and departure	Activity Leader
